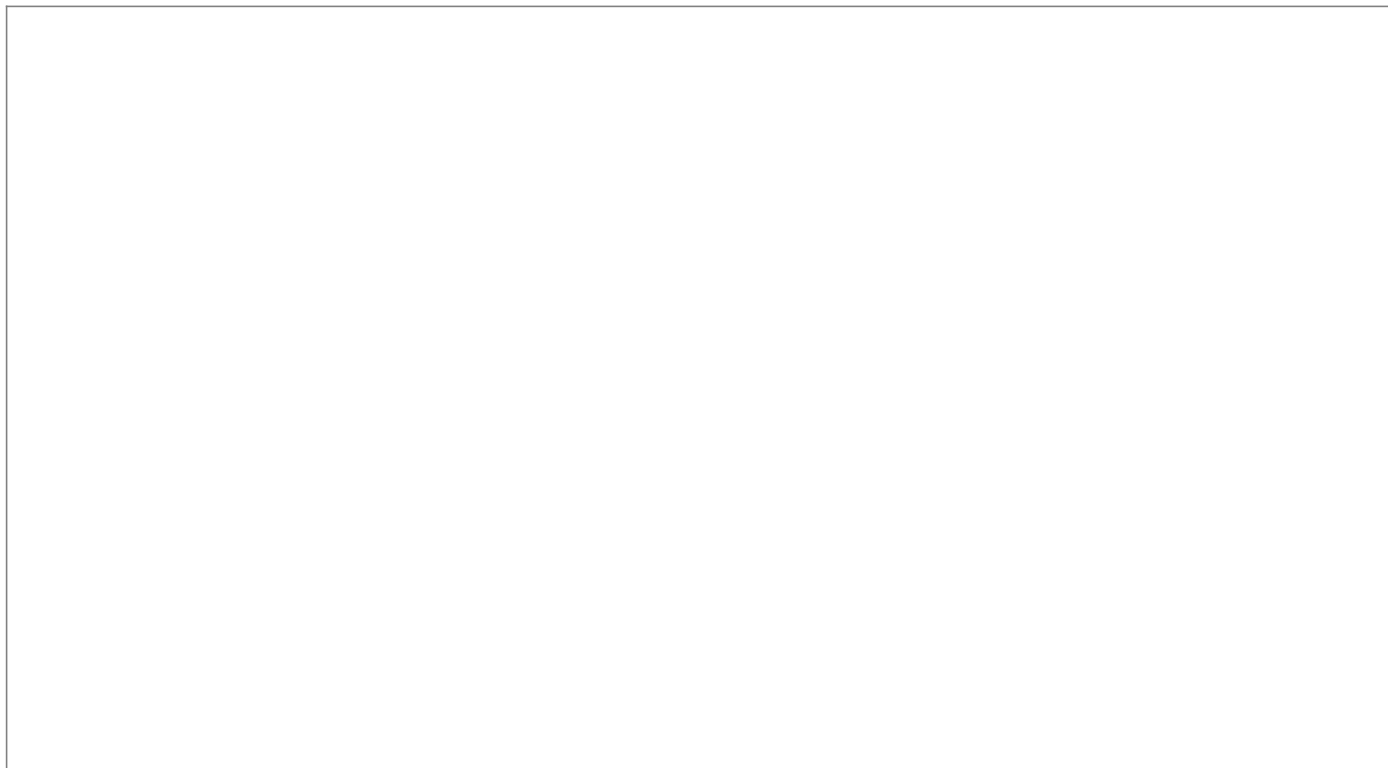

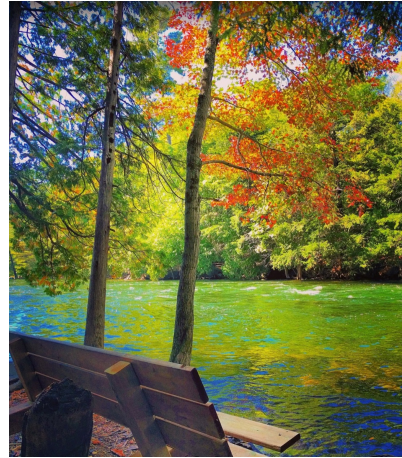

The Wilderness and Canoe Symposium

The Wilderness Canoe Association is a proud founding and continuing supporter of the Wilderness and Canoeing Symposium which each winter brings together a roster of experienced wilderness travellers to provide presentations on various wild rivers and areas across Canada.

The first "Wilderness & Canoeing Symposium" took place in 1986. It was a small gathering of kindred spirits who came together to view each other's trip presentations in the Toronto living room of George Luste, one of Canada's wilderness expedition canoeing icons. Due to the event's popularity, it was subsequently moved to more spacious locations, and it has been a highlight of wilderness paddlers' calendars for over three decades now.

Since the pandemic, the Symposium has moved to a virtual environment, streaming the event live on Zoom, making this outstanding experience accessible to canoeists everywhere.
